Our speaker: Dr.
Stephen
Seamands is
professor of Christian
Doctrine. He has
served as a professor
at Asbury Theological
Seminary since 1983.
He received a B.A.
from Asbury College,

1970; a M.Div. from Asbury Theological Seminary, 1972; a Th.M. from Princeton Theological Seminary, 1974; and a Ph.D. from Drew University, 1983.

Dr. Seamands was the 2005-2006 recipient of the Excellence in Teaching and Learning Award at Asbury Seminary. His book, *Ministry in the Image of God: The Trinitarian Shape of Christian Service* (InterVarsity Press, 2005), received the 2006 Christianity Today Award of Merit for books in the area of church and pastoral leadership.

Before coming to Asbury Seminary, Dr. Seamands pastored United Methodist churches in New Jersey for 11 years. He also pastored Hebron United Methodist Church in Kentucky from 1984 to 1986. He is an ordained elder in the Kentucky Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church.

In addition to teaching and working with seminary students, Dr. Seamands is actively engaged in leading seminars and retreats and conducting spiritual renewal events in local churches across the United States. He has a particular interest in **theological and spiritual** renewal within the United Methodist church, as well as the larger body of Christ. He also has a deep concern for the spiritual needs of pastors and Christian leaders. His workshops, The Healing Power of Forgiveness and Overcoming Barriers to Experiencing God's Love, which he has presented at scores of churches and conferences, have ministered deeply to the brokenness in people's lives. He is regularly involved in what he describes as a ministry of Inealing Drayer to seminary students. Dr. Seamands and his wife, Carol, have four children and eight grandchildren.

His books include Christology and Transition in the Theology of Edwin Lewis (1987), Holiness of Heart and Life (1990), A Conversation with Jesus (1994), Wounds That Heal: Bringing Our Hurts to the Cross (2003).

Features of the 7th Wesleyan Seminar:

- 1. An **opening worship** creatively designed in accordance with the Wesleyan tradition;
- 2. Both academic and practical lectures;
- 3. **Ministry time** intentionally set aside for the participants to seek God's face and healing grace;
- 4. Two **early morning chapel services** (5:15-6:15 a.m.) which enable the participants to experience the wonder of worship in the early morning;
- 5. MTS's **library** with 37,000 titles and 150 journals as well as the **Wesley Centre for Research and Practical Theology** are accessible during the seminar.
