Last-year I was teaching Homiletics to a class of eleven pastors, Bible school's dean and teachers in East Asia. I painstakingly taught them to lift up the cross in their messages because the power of the Gospel not only justifies the believers, it also sanctifies and glorifies them.

However, when I was listening to each student's preaching, I could not hear any mention of the cross at all, except the last lady preacher who barely mentioned the cross after many evaluations.

I asked them, "Why didn't you all preach the cross?"

They answered, "I forgot!" Or "I am not used to preaching the cross!" or "I thought the congregation are all believers. I do not need to preach the cross."

So I said, "No wonder the government of Zhejiang province is taking down all the crosses because we ourselves as pastors have already taken down the cross! We have not lifted up the cross in our preaching! Now the government is just doing what we have been doing all this while. There is nothing to be astounded or shocking about. There is nothing to be protesting about."

Dear brothers and sisters, have our pulpits today taken down the cross? Please listen carefully to the preaching today. How many pastors are still preaching the cross? Most pastors do not think that our congregations need to hear the cross. Most Sunday school teachers also think that our Sunday school students do not need the message of the cross. Therefore we seldom preach or teach the cross. In the long run, congregations would think that the cross is not important at all. So they would not have the burden for the Gospel. They would not invite non-Christian friends to come to worship or Sunday school. And they themselves would find it difficult to live a Christian life apart from the power of the cross.

One day, would the crosses on the Malaysian churches be taken down? Would the taking down of the cross incident in West Malaysia be a prediction of the future? I don't know. But I do know that if we ourselves do not cherish the

cross, we have lost the value of churches' existence; we have lost the power of the Gospel to give us full salvation.

Apostle Paul firmly proclaims, "For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified." (1 Corinthians 2:2)



4. MTS Financial Situation

4.1. MTS General Fund

Currently we seldom have regular donors for MTS General Fund. That is why this year we are facing deficits almost every month. Please pray for God's providence towards "MTS General Fund". 4.2. Friends of MTS

In the previous MTS Newsletter, MTS had published about the needs of "Friends of MTS" as follow: "There are some students from the Iban churches and foreign nations such as China who need committed churches and members to support them. Besides the needy students, we also have lecturers who need constant upgrading in order to provide better training for our students. Such upgrading also needs funding. We are inviting you to prayerfully consider to support them."

We thank the Lord for the responses from some churches and members in becoming the "Friends of MTS". As until June 30th, 2015, amounts received in "Friends of MTS" are as follow:

- 1. Support Iban students: RM 48,830
- 2. Support students from China: RM 18,650
- 3. Support in Faculty upgrading: RM 4,600

This year, we have 8 Iban students, total expenses for year 2015 would be RM 76,840. Therefore for year 2015, we are still short of RM 28,010. In order to support all the 8 Iban students until they graduate, total amount needed would be RM 146,800.

Whereas for students from China, we have recruited 5 in June. Total expenses for 5 international students in year 2015 will come to RM 29,350, and still short of RM 10,700. The total amount to support all the 5 students from China until they graduate will come to RM 218,270.
